My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

A blessed Most Holy Trinity Sunday to you! Today we remember and celebrate the special nature of our God. One of the many important things that Jesus revealed to us is that we have one God in three Persons – Father, Son and Holy

Spirit. The Trinity remains a mystery in a lot of ways. We are limited in the degree to which we can wrap our minds around the reality of the Trinity. That shouldn't be a surprise because God is infinite, and we are not. We can forget how deeply Trinitarian we are. If we pay close attention, we can see that our prayers in the celebration of the Mass are thoroughly Trinitarian. There is the old Latin phrase, "*Lex Orandi. Lex Credendi.*" The way we pray is what we believe. Through our prayer as individuals and as a community, may we be drawn even more deeply into the mystery and the love of our God, the Most Holy Trinity.

Priestly Ordination

The ordination to the priesthood last Saturday at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral was beautiful and inspiring. Two of the four newly ordained priests have connections with our Quo Vadis Domine Family. Father Lizandro Barba, the son of José Luis and Luz Barba, is also a son of St. Alfred Parish. Father Dan Whalen served in our family of parishes this year. Fr. Lizandro offered a thank you speech at the end of the ordination on behalf of his ordination classmates to the many people who helped them on the way to their ordination. I appreciated the way that he reminded everyone at the cathedral on the occasion of his ordination of the "universal call to holiness." All of us, not just priests, are called by God to holiness in our lives.

What exactly does it mean for us that God is calling us to holiness? That's a question for each of us to reflect upon because what holiness means differs for us from person to person depending upon our state and situation of life. For any of us, it means having our lives rooted in God. It means moving beyond self-centeredness. It means living our lives for God and for other people. It's easy to think that holiness is only possible in the extraordinary. If that's true, then most of us wouldn't have a shot at holiness because we live our lives mostly in the ordinary. St. Thérèse of Lisieux offers us hope and inspiration in her beautiful spiritual memoir, *The Story of a Soul*. She reminds us of our call and our opportunity to do little things with great love. Any of us can do that with God's help.

What help do we have from God with the lifetime project that is our call to holiness? We have the Word of God in the scriptures to guide us. We have Jesus still present with us through the Eucharist. We have the same gifts of the Holy Spirit that first disciples received

at Pentecost. We have everything we need to become holy. The challenge for us is that we have more obstacles to holiness than ever before. Due to our technological advances and the ever-decreasing moral standards of our world, we have more means for temptations to affect us than ever before. We also have more distractions than ever that can keep us from getting around to growing in holiness. We need Jesus. With Jesus, yes, we can embrace our call to holiness and the many blessings that can be a part of this for us.

El Diario del Padre John

Mis hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

¡Que tengan un bendito Domingo de la Santísima Trinidad! Hoy recordamos y celebramos la naturaleza especial de nuestro Dios. Una de las muchas cosas importantes que Jesús nos reveló es que tenemos un solo Dios en tres Personas: Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo. La Trinidad sigue siendo un misterio en muchos sentidos. Somos limitados en la medida en que podemos abarcar con nuestra mente la realidad de la Trinidad. Esto no debería sorprendernos, pues Dios es infinito y nosotros no. Podemos llegar a olvidar cuán profundamente trinitarios somos. Si prestamos mucha atención, podemos ver que nuestras oraciones en la celebración de la Misa son enteramente trinitarias. Existe la antigua frase latina: “Lex Orandi, Lex Credendi.” La forma en que oramos es lo que creemos. A través de nuestra oración, tanto individual como comunitaria, que seamos atraídos aún más profundamente hacia el misterio y el amor de nuestro Dios: la Santísima Trinidad.

Ordenación Sacerdotal

La ordenación sacerdotal celebrada el pasado sábado en la Catedral del Santísimo Sacramento fue hermosa e inspiradora. Dos de los cuatro sacerdotes recién ordenados tienen vínculos con nuestra Familia Quo Vadis Domine. El Padre Lizandro Barba, hijo de José Luis y Luz Barba, es también hijo de la Parroquia San Alfredo. El Padre Dan Whalen prestó servicio en nuestra familia de parroquias durante este año. Al finalizar la ceremonia, el Padre Lizandro pronunció un discurso de agradecimiento en nombre de sus compañeros de ordenación dirigido a las muchas personas que los acompañaron y ayudaron en el camino hacia su sacerdocio. Valoré profundamente la manera en que, con motivo de su ordenación, recordó a todos los presentes en la catedral la “llamada universal a la santidad.” Todos nosotros, no solo los sacerdotes, somos llamados por Dios a la santidad en nuestras vidas.

¿Qué significa exactamente para nosotros que Dios nos llame a la santidad? Esa es una pregunta sobre la que cada uno de nosotros debe reflexionar, pues el significado de la santidad varía de una persona a otra, dependiendo de nuestro estado y situación de vida. Para cualquiera de nosotros, significa tener nuestra vida arraigada en Dios. Significa ir más allá del egocentrismo. Significa vivir nuestra vida para Dios y para los demás. Es fácil pensar que la santidad solo es posible en lo extraordinario. Si eso fuera cierto, la mayoría de nosotros no tendría oportunidad alguna de alcanzar la santidad, ya que vivimos nuestra vida, en su mayor parte, en lo ordinario. Santa Teresa de Lisieux nos ofrece esperanza e inspiración en sus hermosas memorias espirituales: Historia de un alma. Ella nos recuerda nuestra vocación y la oportunidad que tenemos de realizar las cosas pequeñas con un gran amor. Cualquiera de nosotros puede lograrlo con la ayuda de Dios. ¿Qué ayuda recibimos de Dios para ese proyecto de toda una vida que constituye nuestro llamado a la santidad? Contamos con la Palabra de Dios en las Escrituras para guiarnos. Tenemos a Jesús, que sigue presente entre nosotros a través de la Eucaristía. Poseemos los mismos dones del Espíritu Santo que

recibieron los primeros discípulos en Pentecostés. Tenemos todo lo necesario para alcanzar la santidad. El desafío que enfrentamos radica en que, hoy más que nunca, existen obstáculos que dificultan nuestro camino hacia la santidad. Debido a los avances tecnológicos y al constante deterioro de los estándares morales de nuestro mundo, disponemos de más vías que nunca para que las tentaciones nos afecten. Asimismo, tenemos más distracciones que nunca, las cuales pueden impedirnos dedicarnos realmente a crecer en santidad. Necesitamos a Jesús. Con Jesús, sí, podemos acoger nuestro llamado a la santidad y las numerosas bendiciones que este puede depararnos.

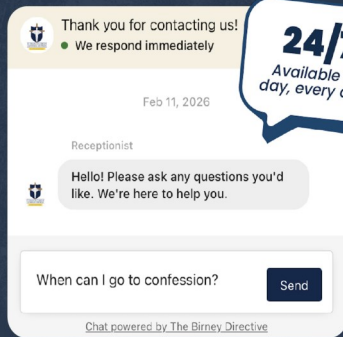

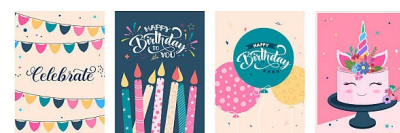

The five C's of mental health are a framework used to improve emotional well-being and Resilience, commonly defined as Connection, Coping, Calmness, Care and Compassion.

These principles help manage stress, build stronger relationships and foster a balanced, positive mindset.

Here is a breakdown of the five C's of mental Health:
Connection: Fostering strong, healthy relationships and social networks to avoid isolation.

Coping: Developing healthy mechanisms to manage stress and emotions, rather than relying on unhealthy habits.

Calmness: Cultivating a sense of peace to reduce chronic stress and help the nervous system, which improves clarity and emotional regulation.

Care (or Character): Practicing self-care, maintaining integrity, and taking care of one's own needs. Which strengthens self-respect and purpose.

Compassion: Showing empathy toward others and practicing self-compassion by recognizing the grace given to us even during tough times.

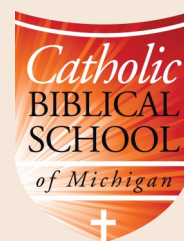

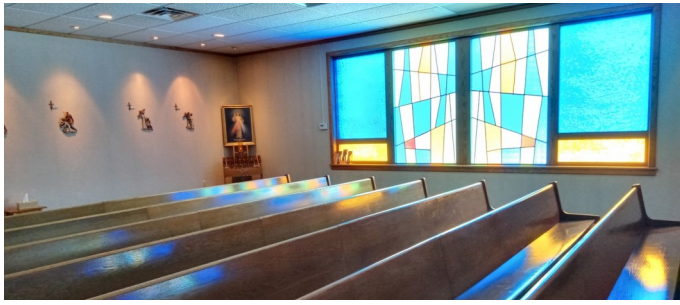

The Most Holy Trinity

Life, the Universe, and Everything

Why does God love us so much? And why are we able to love others? The answer to these questions is found in the meaning of today's feast. Trinity Sunday celebrates not so much an idea of three-in-one as the relationship of the Persons of the Trinity with each other and with us.

The idea is that the Father expressed himself as the Word. Since it was a perfect expression, the Word is his Son and equal to the Father. The love of Father and Son is expressed as the Holy Spirit. Being a perfect love, it too is equal to Father and Son. So even the idea of the Trinity is based on love. But God's love was so great, God went even further. God created us to be loved by God.

In the second reading Paul blesses the Corinthians with the "love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit." The book of Genesis (3:18) says that it was not good for man to be alone. So God created woman, and through man and woman all humanity, to be able to love each other.

Though human love is not perfect, the love of man and woman can produce another person, a child. The three Persons of the Trinity share one life in God. But through baptism, we also share in God's life. Just as parents love to see how their children look like them, so God loves to see the divine in us.

The first reading reminds us of God's closeness to humanity. Moses can speak to God and God responds by granting his request. The Gospel tells how much God loves the world, that God's own Son was sent to die for us. But we sometimes forget that God's love comes first. We think that the more loving we are, the more God will love us. But love comes from God (1 John 4:7-11), so when we love someone it doesn't make God love us more; we love because God loves us first.

Our decision to love is a response to God's love, and our ability to love is itself a gift from God. The meaning of life, the universe, and everything is Love, the love of the Trinity for each other and for us.

The question now is, how well do we use that gift of God's love by loving each other?
